

CONTINUOUS ENROLLMENT

Students who do not maintain continuous enrollment (a minimum of one course during the semester – certain student populations may have stricter requirements) at Concordia University Chicago from semester to semester (fall and spring, excluding summer) will be administratively withdrawn (<https://catalog.cuchicago.edu/undergraduate/academic-information/university-withdrawal/>) from the University if students are not enrolled in any terms that semester per CUC's academic calendar. (<https://catalog.cuchicago.edu/undergraduate/academic-calendars/>)

Failure to maintain continuous enrollment (unless the student is eligible, successfully files for, and is granted a leave of absence (<https://catalog.cuchicago.edu/undergraduate/academic-information/leave-of-absence-status/>)) may result in withdrawal (<https://catalog.cuchicago.edu/undergraduate/academic-information/university-withdrawal/>) from the university and requires a petition to request readmission. Some examples of risks include, but are not limited to the following:

- Expiration of previously-earned transfer or CUC credit.
- Change in academic requirements under a new catalog.
- Change in degree offerings under a new catalog.
- Change in availability of courses under a new course rotation and/or cohort template.
- Timeline to graduation/completion may be delayed.
- Change of enrollment status, which might impact finances.
- Placement of administrative holds that impact registration.
- Tuition and/or fee rate increase.
- Failure to be approved for reentry due to academic standing.
- Failure to be approved for reentry due to expiring time limit for program completion (graduate students only).
- Lack of access to support from members of the dissertation committee (doctoral students only).
- Change in composition of dissertation chair and/or committee (doctoral students only).
